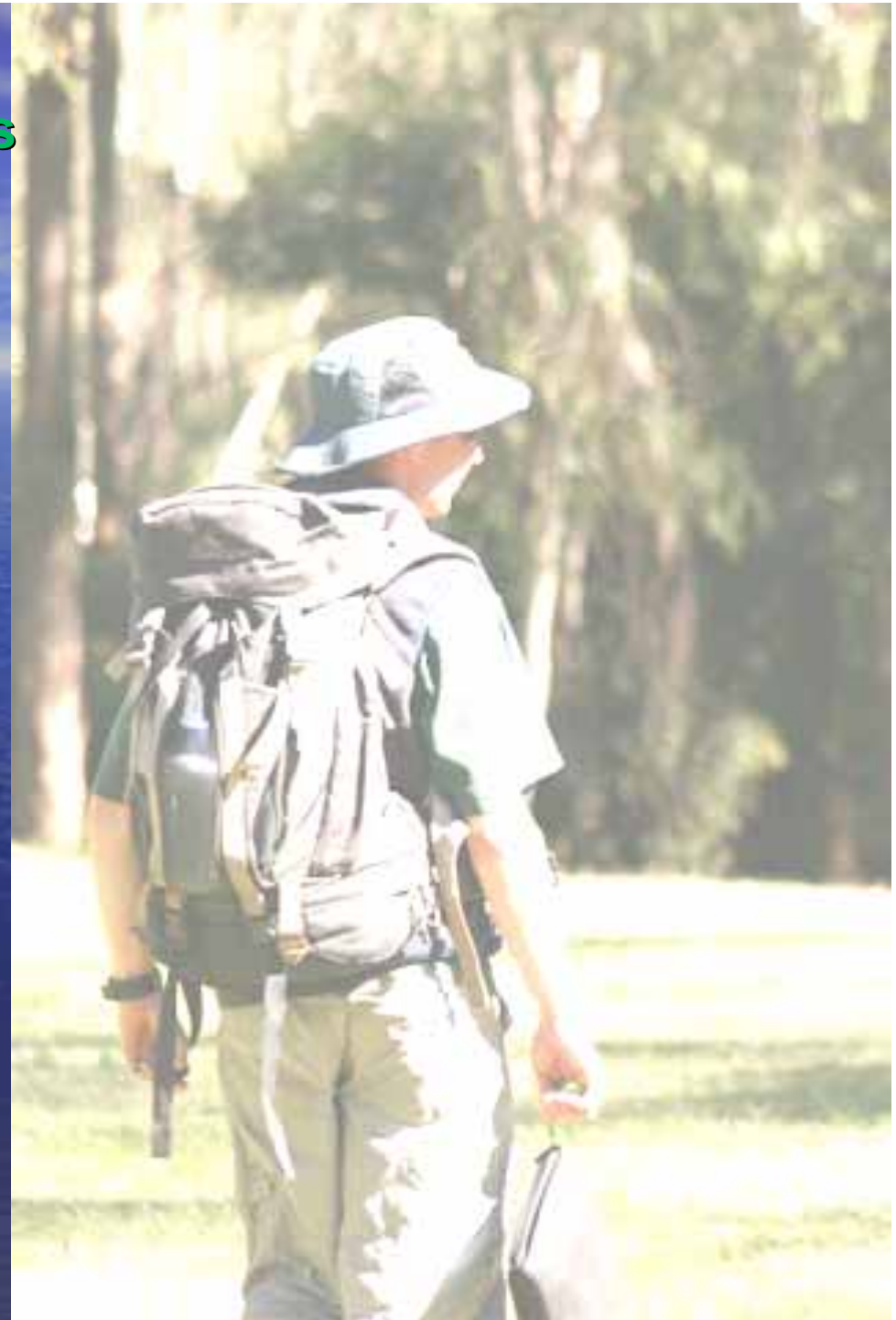

- In Australia we have the sink or swim course
 - Learn on the run
 - Do the best job we can
 - We have had many competent graduates
- Increase the support structure around our industry and offer broader training opportunities

A Pilot Program for 2009

Goals of the course

- Goal One - To present the basics of camp management in the core areas of the organized body of knowledge
- Goal 2 - To expand their network of peers and develop a community of professionals in a "camp like" atmosphere
- Goal 3 - To provide an introduction to self-directed learning and the participants' role in their own professional development process

Why do we need a course?

- Last 15 years has seen many changes and compliance is a major focus.
- RRAM -Regulations, Ramifications Accreditations and Modifications are all words used broadly across our industry
- Professional development and the opportunity to network with others

What are the compliance and considerations for a camp manager?

- A number of regulations, compliances and considerations in the one melting pot.
 - Vision and camp business sustainability
 - Accommodation - fire systems and essential services
 - Grounds management- arborists and grounds risk assessments
 - Catering commercial kitchens standards - food handling and kitchen regulations
 - Activities - Activity Standards (Aquatic, Ropes, cycle, ratios, qualifications, equipment, logging, reporting, checking, maintaining, briefing, debriefing, risk assessments, etc)
 - Work place agreements and HR requirements
 - Buildings and asset standards
 - Manage the ins and outs
 - Look after the client
 - Participant Outcomes?
 - Plus more
